





1.3 Quality of the supervision and of the integration in the institution

I will benefit greatly from the first-rate quality mentoring of I. Foletti, Full Professor of Medieval art, whose competence is demonstrated by his prolific scientific production and by his involvement, often in a leading role, in national and international projects, conferences, and activities addressed to broader public. The supervisor is a specialist in medieval art and culture. His interests focus on art and society around the Mediterranean and beyond in a broad chronological perspective from Late Antiquity to the late Middle Ages, and, most importantly, for the present project, he is dealing since many years on the interaction between visual art and rhetoric. During the academic year 2018-2019 he was moreover Adjunct Professor at Ca' Foscari, University of Venice, and had thus exceptional relationship with local Venetian institutions. Since 2013, the supervisor has secured more than 3,8 M€ as PI or co-investigator on grants, including as leader of several international projects. He is also the director and co-founder of the periodical Convivium (WOS, SCOPUS, ERICH), whose editorial board includes prominent international scholars. The supervisor is also founder and director of the CEMS and director of the Hans Belting Library. He is author of several monographs: his publication list includes 30 articles in peer-reviewed journals. He has organized or co-organized more than 30 international scientific events and edited more than 35 collective monographs. It is therefore certain that he could provide me with outstanding mentorship and give me the chance to take part in highlevel events and publications. These include workshops that I will have the opportunity to organize myself, with related proceedings, but also the possibility to participate in the many conferences and public lectures organized by the CEMS. His research group includes six post-doctoral researchers, 10 PhD students, three editors, four graphic designers, one project manager, one secretary, and one specialist in communication. Since autumn 2017, the CEMS

regularly hosts *Hans Belting fellows* who are working on the cultural interplay in the Medieval Mediterranean. Thus, I would be integrated in a highly international, dynamic, and **gender balanced** environment where I look forward to fruitful interaction. The supervisor also engages in **extensive didactic activity**. He taught courses of Medieval and Byzantine Art in Switzerland, Czech Republic, Italy, France, Finland, and Russia. He has supervised 70 **BA and MA** theses, three **PhD** and seven post-docs. Since 2016, he has worked on a series of multimedia outputs dedicated to wide audiences. The CEMS have produced more than **25 short movies** aimed at broad audience. Since September 2020, in collaboration with Czech TV Art, he is launching a monthly series of short movies about medieval art. Its goal is to promote art historical research to broad audience, with the ambition to show its relevance to local communities and policymakers. I will be fully included in the CEMS media communication projects.



ABSTRACT – AN EXAMPLE

- The way the text unfolds is important everywhere not only in the abstract develop gradually your ideas, invite kindly into the story, avoid jumping like crazy! Tell it is important.
- Generalist colour, "unfolding" colour, specialist colour, emotional/(sense of) urgency

Plants constitute an essential pillar of earth's ecosystem and they are the most important source for human nutrition. If we want to understand how plants evolve, how to utilize their valuable traits and how to devise smart plant breeding programs we have to study the molecular mechanisms of meiosis.

Meiosis is a specialized, two-step cell division that ensures the reduction of the genome prior to the formation of generative cells. It is during meiosis, that genetic information between maternal and paternal Chromosomes is mutually exchanged, leading to novel combinations of genetic traits in the following generation.

Meiotic recombination is initiated by DNA double strand breaks (DSBs). Specific DSB promoting proteins, among them the topoisomerase-related SPO11, introduce DSBs at various positions throughout the genome. Dedicated DNA repair mechanism ensure that the breaks are repaired in such a manner that maternal and paternal chromosomal parts become mutually exchanged. Given the importance of the DSB forming complex in determining the sites and the frequency of genetic exchange it is surprising that the biochemical characteristics of this complex have not yet been elucidated. The proposed project aims at the thorough characterisation of the meiotic DSB complex of the model plant Arabidopsis thaliana.... ETC. ETC.



in Europe and beyond. Potential poles of research which I would like to interweave ties with are the Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Science Sociale in Paris and the Rutgers University, NJ, in the USA.

The dissemination of the project results is fundamental to create these synergies and will be guaranteed through the following outputs. 1) The publication of three articles (see 3.1: GC D3.1-D4.1) to be submitted to peer-reviewed journals of high international quality and relevant to my research topics, ideally ranked in O1 or O2, such as Art Bulletin, Early Medieval Europe, and Convivium, Besides, in collaboration with CEMS I will organize 2) an international workshop in Brno, MU, "Lombardy in the Middle Ages as an Intersection: between East, West, North, and South", (see 3.1: GC W1), Among the invited scholars are envisaged M. Bacci, H. Kessler, F. Dell'Acqua, M. Rossi. The proceedings will be published as Supplementum of the peer-reviewed journal Convivium in 2023. Finally, so that the impact of my research may also reach a non-European audience, I intend to participate 3) to the Medieval International Congress in Leeds (see 3.1: GC C1) and to the International Congress of Medieval Studies in Kalamazoo (see 3.1 GC C2).

2.3 Quality of the proposed measures to communicate the project activities to different target audiences

As stated above, myMy project aims to produce a wide-spectrum impact, capable of creating bridges between today and yesterday, between historical and social disciplines, between science and politics, and between the academic and non-academic worlds. The measures I will take to communicate with the different target audiences are rich and varied and involve different media.

A) In the context of the series StředověC JinaX (the Middle Ages Differently), organized monthly by the CEMS for students of humanities (approx. 60 persons), I will deliver two lectures on some of the macro themes of the project. Their working titles are "Lombard medieval artifacts as a place of identity construction" and "From Europe to Constantinople and back. The circulation of literary and visual themes in the Lombard space" (see 3.1: GC L2-L3). B) Three are the main actions that I have planned in collaboration with the supervisor to reach a broader audience in the Czech Republic. 1) I will deliver a lecture at a widely popular institution Brno taking recourse to the Planetarium and Observatory entitled "Female patronage. In the shadow of Theophano" (see 3.1: GC P1). This

To sum up the impact of the project will be very high touching many different t Farget a Audiences - from high schools to the university of the third age, and to the international groups of pilgrims and tourists reaching Conques. The dissemination activities of the CONQUES project will answer, in Conques, to a burning social and cultural need: the publications and dissemination outputs we aim to produce are simply missing. These outputs will answer to a double necessity. On the one handFirst, they are crucial to protect and promote European and World cultural heritage. Moreover, it will enable the large audience to experience past cultures. and to understand in a different way the current ones. The past cultural heritage has also always been a way of constructing present identities. In this sense the repriect will challenge both past nationalistic constructions, opening the path to a much more global and shared understanding of the past.

This is particularly relevant today, with the spread of COVID-19, reminding us of "black swans" that can unexpectedly and instantly test cohesiveness and viability of humankind. Novel findings on our distant past are important contribution to forthcoming reconsiderations of our society, and may help us to react knowingly on present challenges, be it, when some political groups are using the crisis of the diffusion of COVID-19, to bring backa -revival of nationalistic ideas tendencies, or any other slip towards ends that justify means and closing borders. A project on the past may thus give keys to react on present challenges.

1. 4. Quality and efficiency of the implementation

Coherence and effectiveness of the work plan, including appropriateness of the allocation of tasks and resources

The workplan of the whole project has been constructed in a very rational way, following two major criteria: 1) the necessity of a preliminary collection of archival and archaeometrical data; 2) the structure of the secondments, following the general pyramidal structure of the proposed project. This will permit to the project a coherent movement across countries and continents.

The first year (2021) will thus be mainly concentrated around Conques, and more generally France. During this year, a summer school and a meeting will be organized in Conques, during which a proper field research will be accomplished: the abbey-church will be measured for the auralization, the interior and exterior surfaces will be video-scanned, the floor will be scanned with the GPR (WP1).

During the same period, 3 scholars (MU, BHR) will spend in all 5 months in Conques in order to be trained into the dissemination skills, doing in parallel research. This will lead to the publication of 2 small booklets targeting pilgrims and tourists (WP4). In addition to that, the 2 media specialists from MU will spend 1 month




